PUPIL PREMIUM & SPORT FUNDING

Pupil Premium

The Department for Education defines the Pupil Premium as 'additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peer's'.

We are required to publish details of how our school spends its Pupil Premium and the effect this has had on the attainment of pupils who attract the funding.

Due to the small number of Pupils at the School and those receiving Pupil Premium funding, we keep our information on the website more general so that individual children cannot be identified.

For 2015/16, we have received a total Pupil Premium allocation of £10,980.

This additional funding was used in a variety of ways after individual discussions between the Head teacher and the parents/guardians of the eligible pupils.

This included -

1. Specialist dyslexia teaching and additional TA support.
2. One-to-one weekly lessons with a specialist SEN teacher.
3. Offsite provision of specialist support from the IPT team.
4. Small group intervention with a TA.
5. Music lessons.
6. Purchasing and training in the Numicon Breaking Barriers Maths intervention.

This helped in a variety of ways -

1. Improving self- esteem.
2. Providing good quality off site education and integration back into school.
3. Improving the progress made by children.

In 2016/2017 we received a total pupil premium allocation of £10980.

This was used for:

1. Specialist 'Catch Up' English training.
2. Music lessons.
3. One-to-one and small group weekly booster teaching from a teacher.
4. Small group maths intervention.
5. Purchasing of resources, specifically reading books related to 'Catch up' English.

This continued to help in a variety of ways –

1. Improving the reading age of children.
2. Improving children's confidence related to reading.
3. Providing children with good basis maths skills, particularly in the four operations and times tables in preparation for Secondary School.
4. Enabling opportunities in music.

In 2017/18 we have received a total pupil premium allocation of £4840

This will be used for:

1. Music lessons.
2. Support with School trips/residentials.
3. Purchasing of extra reading resources to challenge more able readers.

PE and Sport Funding

The government is providing all primary schools with additional monies in the form of a 'PE and Sport Premium' with the objective of schools using this funding 'to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer'.

It is intended that the premium should be used to:

- Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that our school already offers.
- Make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years. These investments and improvements will offer sustainable provision.

In 2015/16, we received a PE and Sport Premium allocation of £9840.

As a result, we were able to:

1. Buy into the Anthony Gell School Sports Partnerships.
2. Continue with a whole school house system to enable regular, inter-house sports competitions for pupils of all ages.
3. Subsidise infant swimming (some parental contributions and any shortfall covered by the school).
4. Pay for transport and access to indoor sports facilities at Alfreton (because of the very limited floor space in the school).
5. Cover the costs of entering the Water Polo League.
6. Landscape and turf the new land adjacent to school to improve the schools facilities for sport and outdoor learning.
7. Put aside some funds for further development of the purchased land adjacent to the school for sport and physical development.
8. Use a dance coach to work with the class teachers to improve the quality of dance provision in the school.

The impact of this funding was;

1. Achieving the School games Gold award
2. 100% of year 5 and 6 pupils took part in extra- curricular competitions.
3. 100% of year 5 and 6 pupils played water polo in the Matlock League, with one team finishing as runners up.
4. 100% of children (KS1 and KS2) took part in extra- curricular sporting activities.
5. Children were able to participate in a wider range of sporting activities with the quality of PE provision being significantly enhanced by access to Alfreton sports hall.
6. 100% of juniors can now swim 10 metres or further without aids.
7. The year 5 and 6 swimming team won the school swimming gala at The Arc, Matlock.
8. The new land was used for outdoor learning, break time activities and early year's outdoor provision.

9. The quality of dance teaching across the school was improved, with some children choosing to take part in after school dance sessions.

In 2016/17, we will receive a PE and Sport Premium allocation of £8253.

We will use this to:

1. Buy into the Anthony Gell Sports Partnerships.
2. Buy into the Rural Derbyshire Sports Partnership.
3. Continue with a whole school house system to enable regular, inter-house sports competitions for pupils of all ages.
4. Fund infant swimming and provide access to Alfreton sports hall for KS1 PE.
5. Pay for transport and access to indoor sports facilities at Alfreton (because of the very limited floor space in the school).
6. Cover the costs of 2 teams entering the Water Polo League.
7. Cover the cost of Water Polo competitions through Matlock Water Polo Club.
8. Introduce combat sports into the school curriculum.
9. Provide coaching fencing training for sports co-ordinator and purchase new fencing equipment.
10. Provide Taekwondo coaching sessions.
11. Introduce the sport of Archery and have a coach in to deliver some taster sessions.
12. Put aside some funds for further development of the purchased land adjacent to the school for sport and physical development.

The impact of the funding was;

1. Achieving the School games award.
2. KS2 children had the opportunity to enter a variety of sporting completions/events through the Sport Partnership.
3. 100% of children took part in inter-house competitions in a variety of sports.
4. 100% of children (KS1 and KS2) took part in extra- curricular sporting activities.
5. Children were able to participate in a wider range of sporting activities with the quality of PE provision being significantly enhanced by access to Alfreton sports hall. This was extended to include our Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children.
6. 100% of children are water confident and aware of water safety.
7. All Year 5/6 pupils took part in Water Polo competitions.
8. Year 4 children were given the opportunity to participate in Water Polo, training and competition.
9. KS2 children were taught lifesaving skills during drowning prevention week, both in class and at the pool.
10. The new land was used for outdoor learning, break time activities and early year's outdoor provision.
11. The children had the opportunity to try Archery and Taekwondo.
12. Sports Coordinated trained in fencing to introduce next year.

In 2017/18, we will receive a PE and Sport Premium allocation of £13085.

We will use this to:

1. Buy into the Anthony Gell Sports Partnerships.

2. Buy into the Rural Derbyshire Sports Partnership.
3. Continue with a whole school house system to enable regular, inter-house sports competitions for pupils of all ages.
4. Continue to fund infant swimming and provide access to Alfreton sports hall for KS1 PE.
5. Pay for transport and access to indoor sports facilities at Alfreton (because of the very limited floor space in the school).
6. Cover the costs of 2 teams entering the Water Polo League.
7. Introduce Free after School Sports clubs 3 times per week.
8. Purchase archery equipment and introduce across the school.
9. Introduce the sport of fencing across the School.
10. Allocate a play leader at lunch-time to lead time-tabled sporting activities.
11. Provide training for lunch time staff.
12. Provide training for teaching assistants.
13. Develop an area of land so we have more all-weather surface to improve our provision.
